

ICS 300 – Intermediate ICS for Expanding Incidents

Purpose

This course provides training on and resources for personnel who require advanced application of the Incident Command System (ICS).

Who Should Attend

The target audience for this course is individuals who may assume a supervisory role in expanding incidents. Note: During an expanding incident, some or all of the Command and General Staff positions may be activated, as well as Division/Group Supervisor and/or Unit Leader level positions. These incidents may extend into multiple operational periods. This course expands upon information covered in the ICS-100 and ICS-200 courses. These earlier courses are prerequisites for ICS-300.

Course Objectives

- Describe how the NIMS Command and Management component supports the management of expanding incidents.
- Describe the incident/event management process for supervisors and expanding incidents as prescribed by the Incident Command System (ICS).
- Implement the incident management process on a simulated expanding incident.
- Develop an Incident Action Plan for a simulated incident.
